



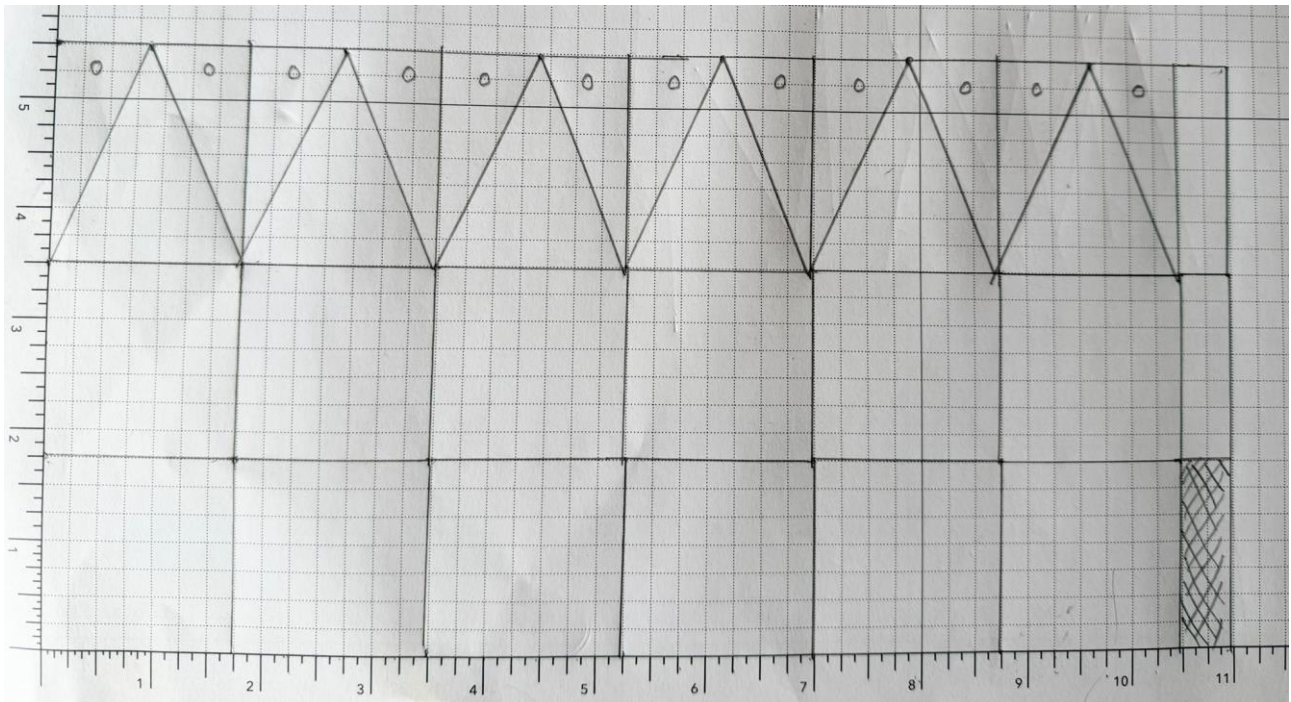
Hexagonal Gift Box

Hello, crafty friends! I decided to resize a recent Hexagonal Gift Box that I made. I promised my current and new MailChimp subscribers that I would type this up for them, and I am keeping that promise.



My project features the wonderful 12x12 “A Stitched Season” Christmas DSP! It is a new online exclusive launching in July 26! I also used Real Red and Basic White Cardstock with some white ribbon. These would make wonderful gifts, stocking fillers, care packages, teacher gifts, and craft fair items.

Template Scoring Guide



I have added instructions on how to make this, step by step on the next page!



Project Instructions

Box:

- Cut DSP / Cardstock to 11" x 5-1/2"
- Long side to top score at: 1-3/4", 3-1/2", 5-1/4", 7", 8-3/4" and 10-1/2"
- Short side to top score at: 1-3/4" and 3-1/2"
- Fold and Burnish
- With the smallest sections (glue tabs) on the right side of you, cut away the bottom small rectangle
- Cut up each glue tab
- Mark with a pencil, a little dot at the top of your six panels at top, in at 7/8"
- Score from each bottom corner up to the marked middle on all six panels
- Fold and gently burnish these diagonal score lines
- With a hole punch, punch 12 holes in the smaller triangle sections as per diagram – if easier you can do this once assembled.

Layers:

- For each of the middle panels you will need 6 cardstock mats measuring 1-5/8" squared
- You will also need 6 DSP mats for on top too measuring 1-1/2" squared.
I used the block patterns from the DSP pack and cut them to size
- Cut a piece of card for your sentiment label measuring 3" x 7/8" and layer a piece of white on to it measuring 2-3/4" x 3/4" (this is for stamping on).

Assembly:

- Assemble box - I have a YouTube tutorial available here: https://youtu.be/gXvHbD5Yd_s
- Feed ribbon through the holes and when pulled taught, it will close the box nicely for you. Before you tie your ribbon in a bow, make sure to punch a hole in your label section and add to the ribbon. Also add your contents / goodies / gifts before securing the bow.
